## Julie Lemon, 182 Woodland Street, Newton Falls, OH 44444

Mrs. Lemon came to discuss the ongoing bus situation. When she moved to her home, she was told that the bus would be there between 8:03 a.m. and 8:06 a.m. It has been running very late, and she can't afford a baby sitter in the morning. One day the bus forgot her. She was told that her bus driver was sick. She hopes that he gets better soon, but wondered if there is any way that the school can be open earlier. She has to be at work, and her job will be in jeopardy is she arrives late.

She also wondered if the buses are overcrowded since they have been doubling up. She stated that we just passed a levy, but this is a problem that happened four days already. She wondered if the elementary could be opened earlier for parents who have to get to work. She wondered if the board has a resolution to the problem, or do they know when the problem will end.

Mrs. Davis asked Mr. Woodard to update the board regarding the bus situation. Mr. Woodard said that we do have a serious shortage of drivers. We have drivers off work on medical leave, and we have no substitutes to drive for them. We are doubling and tripling up to get the routes done. The buses are not overcrowded because they take a load and then go back for another one. That's why they are running late. There is a real shortage of drivers in the entire area. We are putting more advertisements out there to try to get more drivers. Contractually, we can't open buildings early because we cannot have the staff there earlier than stated in the negotiated agreement. Mr. Woodard asked if Mrs. Lemon has a friend that could help her out in the mornings until things are straightened out. Mrs. Lemon said that all her friends work. There is nobody available that can help her.

Mrs. Koontz said that Mr. Woodard isn't exaggerating. She is taking bus driver training courses for another district, and people just aren't interested in driving a school bus. Mrs. Koontz asked Mr. Woodard if Mrs. Lemon could drop off their kids at the junior high at an earlier time. Mr. Woodard said that we would be opening up a big liability if we did that. Mrs. Koontz said that it's a difficult situation, but we just don't have the manpower right now.

Mr. Kline said that he knows a woman that runs a day care center in her home that is two houses away from the covered bridge. He knows that she would help Mrs. Lemon for a very reasonable price. He was sure that she would let Mrs. Lemon's child get on the bus there.

Mrs. Davis suggested that we provide Mrs. Lemon with her contact information. Ben Koontz happened to have the phone number available.

We haven't started receiving tax advances yet. Hopefully, the balances will be recovered before the March board meeting.

## Funding

Our second foundation payment in February was the first time that ODE began using this year's attendance data. Overall, our annual funding decreased by \$46,167, and our expenses deducted from the foundation decreased by \$2,093 for a net decrease of \$44,074. This funding amount will most likely continue to decline for the remainder of the year. However, we are hoping that career tech funding will be increasing once ODE begins using current data for that category in March. I will keep you posted

## <u>Lawsuit</u>

Some of you may have seen the article in the Tribune about our lawsuit against Steel City Asphalt. The suit was filed on February 8. I have distributed copies of our complaint for your reference.

## **Bus Repairs**

We have spent approximately \$8,500 so far this school year on outsourced bus repairs. The buses are in a state of disrepair, and we are likely to spend more before it gets better.

We plan to put wireless in the bus garage. The wireless router costs approximately \$100. I was able to purchase both a laptop and the wireless router for \$20 with American Express reward points.

We are going to have to put some money into organizing the bus garage and developing an inventory of basic parts.

## **Medicaid**

I attended a Medicaid webinar on Friday. Beginning August 1<sup>st</sup>, we will have to have a prescription from a physician, physician assistant, or advanced practice nurse in order to receive Medicaid reimbursement for the following services to students on IEPs: physical therapy, audiology, speech pathology, and/or occupational therapy. I was relieved because I originally thought this went into effect last August, but it still will be a timing issue to get all the necessary prescriptions before August. I will keep you updated as information becomes available.

## **Boosters**

I attended a seminar regarding student activities and booster groups. As a result of that meeting, I am going to request quarterly financial reports, bank reconciliations, and a list of officers for each ancillary group. We are also supposed to be reviewing fundraising plans and/or changes before the school year in which they take place.

We also need to be careful that the booster groups identify themselves when they are fundraising. I've noticed that fundraising materials have not been identifying the group doing the selling. All materials must clearly identify the entity.

I'm distributing a copy of our board policy on relations with booster organizations as it already specifies these items.

## Superintendent's Report and Recommendations

## Report

We had our water tested for lead. We are still waiting on the official results, but the preliminary findings all look good. We have a gentleman working four or five hours a day as a mechanic. He currently works at Maplewood Career Center, and will be retiring. We will be hiring him for our part-time mechanic/part-time bus driver position. We have another gentleman who has been working several hours a day to help us out. If our full-time mechanic goes on disability, we are hoping to bring him in full-time. Both gentlemen are certified mechanics.

I talked to Mr. Crowder about having the pledge of allegiance in the junior high and high school. He is going to talk to Mr. Shelby about making it a part of the morning announcements for students who want to participate.

The school report card came out today. The website was bogged down so I was unable to print off information. We don't have any F's or A's. We have several B's and several D's, but we mostly have C's. There is definitely room for improvement. I will have more details at the March board meeting.

I am now meeting with the principals once a week instead of once a month in an attempt to try to make some changes to improve our report card. We are considering having some delayed starts next year in order to create some common planning time for the teachers. The state has been pushing us to do this for years now. It's been difficult because we don't have a lot of staff. The delayed starts would be approximately two hours.

I distributed the proposed calendar for next school year. It's similar to what we have done in the past. The variances are in November, December, and Easter break. Some districts are taking a full two weeks off at Christmas, and some are taking less. TCTC is taking the Monday after Thanksgiving and we are trying that this year. That Monday is a big hunting day for many people. We also added a day to Easter break. Now it will be Good Friday, Monday, and Tuesday. We can't adopt the calendar until 30 days from now.

The Board asked if the change in conferences will be part of the new calendar. Mr. Woodard responded that conferences are a negotiated item that will be discussed when contract negotiations begin.

As you remember, we asked our league if we could leave for just football, or if we could have some leeway over our first five football games to soften the schedule. The league decided that they will not allow us to leave just for football nor will they allow us to soften our schedule. We either have to stay in, or leave completely. The league cancelled their next meeting, and we have to turn in our letter by May 1. Now there won't be any meetings before we have to turn in the letter. We have been invited to join several other leagues which we are investigating now. The Board discussed some of the alternatives with the various leagues. Mr. Woodard proceeded to state that the reality is that we can't continue to do what we are doing. We are bringing in about \$17,000 with our football gate, but we are spending \$50,000 out of general fund. We are solid in our other sports. I want to try to build the football program rather than eliminate it. We are trying to get coaches to attend the athletic council meeting next week, and Mr. Crowder and I plan to meet with the different leagues, but ultimately the decision is yours. I will make a recommendation based on my research, but not everybody will agree.

I have five issues for executive session this evening.
