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## School Parental Involvement Policy/Plan

1. The Newton Falls Elementary School will take the following actions to involve parents in the joint development of its school parental involvement plan under section 1118 of the ESEA: send out parental surveys to get feedback on information parents would like added to the plan.

2.	The Newton Falls Elementary School will take the following actions in involving parents in the process of school review and improvement under section 1116 of the ESEA: distribute parental surveys for feedback; invite parent liaison to our monthly BLT meetings that meets regularly to review school improvement needs.
3.	The Newton Falls Elementary School will hold an informational meeting to inform parents of the school's participation in Title I, Part A programs, and to explain the Title I, Part A requirements and the right of parents to be involved in Title I, Part A programs. This information is also available on the District website. The school will convene the meeting at a time convenient for parents and will offer a flexible number of additional parental involvement meetings, such as in the morning or evening, so that as many parents as possible are able to attend. The school will invite all parents of children participating in Title I, Part A programs to this meeting, and will encourage them to attend.
4.	The Newton Falls Elementary School will provide parents of participating children information in a timely manner about Title I, Part A programs that includes a description and explanation of the school's curriculum, and forms of academic assessment used to measure children's progress, and the proficiency levels students are expected to meet by: distributing this information in the fall, during parent/teacher conferences, and any planned family nights, including being available online.
5.	The Newton Falls Elementary School will at the request of parents, provide opportunities for regular meetings for parents to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions about the education of their children. The school will respond to any such suggestions as soon as practicably possible by: holding a meeting and documenting meeting with notes given to parents/school; holding an intervention assistance team meeting with notes being distributed to parents and school; holding phone conferences with documentation.

- 6. The Newton Falls Elementary School will provide each parent an individual student report about the performance of their child on the State assessment in at least math, language arts and reading by: early fall, as soon as the district receives them. The information on testing will also be communicated on-line as well.
- 7. The Newton Falls Elementary School will take the following actions to provide each parent timely notice: when their child has been assigned or has been taught for four (4) or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not highly qualified within the meaning of the term in section 200.56 of the Tile I Final Regulations (67 Fed. Reg. 71710, December 2, 2002) by: this information would be communicated to the parents by written, letter form as soon as the district is aware. Currently, this is a non-applicable issue to the district.

- 8. The Newton Falls Elementary School will provide assistance to parents of children served by the school, as appropriate, in understanding topics by undertaking the actions described in this paragraph -
  - The state's academic content standards,
  - The state's student academic achievement standards.
  - The state and local academic assessments including alternate assessments,
  - The requirements of Part A,
  - How to monitor their child's progress, and
  - How to work with educators:
- 9. The Newton Falls Elementary School will provide materials and training to help parents work with their child to improve their children's academic achievement, such as literacy, training and using technology, as appropriate, to foster parental involvement, by: holding informational meetings with parents, providing resources online.

10. The Newton Falls Elementary School will, with the assistance of its parents, educate its teachers, pupil services personnel, principals and other staff in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to implement and coordinate parent programs and build ties between parents and schools, by: coordinating with Ohio PIRC and attending workshops to improve upon this process.

11. The Newton Falls Elementary School will, to the extent feasible and appropriate, coordinate and integrate parental involvement programs and activities with Head Start, Reading First, Early Reading First, Even Start, Home Instruction Programs for Preschool Youngsters, and Parents as Teachers Program, public preschool, and other programs. The school will also conduct other activities, such as parent resource centers, that encourage and support parents in more fully participating in the education of their children.
