From Summer to Scholars / JH & HS

Students' first day of school on August 26th, 2021 is fast approaching and we are excited to welcome back our Tigers for the 21-22 school year. The teachers and administrators at the Junior High and High School have been gearing up for an exciting year and both students and parents can expect several changes as we head back to school.

The bell schedule has been adjusted to provide a later start time for students, following recommendations from the American Academy of Sleep Medicine and the American Academy of Pediatrics (see page 4). To address learning gaps created by the pandemic, we have hired additional teachers and a guidance counselor in an effort to keep class sizes small and address the individual needs of all our learners.

We are very pleased to announce that the Junior High School has received "Silver" designation by the Ohio Department of Education for our outstanding implementation of Positive Behavioral Intervention Supports (PBIS)! This is the second year in a row that the Junior High School has received acknowledgement at the state level for its PBIS implementation and we are very excited to see what is in store this year for our students, staff, and community.

The JH/HS will continue to focus on holistic education by not only meeting the academic needs of our students, but also their social-emotional needs. Through our School Quality Improvement Grant, the JH/HS has partnered this year with the International Institute for Restorative Practices to implement the SaferSanerSchools™ Program. The SaferSanerSchools™ program works with school administrators, educators, counselors, and support staff to explicitly build positive school climate and culture using restorative practices (the science of relationships and community). We are also excited to add a hypoallergenic therapy dog in our building this year to further support the needs of our Tigers.

We are excited to announce that FWD Ministries has graciously agreed to provide school supplies for every child in the district, K-12, with the exception of math calculators. FWD Ministries has been extremely involved in providing needed resources to our students and community members and we are grateful for their contributions.

New Changes to Start the Year off / ES & MS

Dear Families,

My name is Justin Christopher and I am happy to be returning to Newton Falls Schools as the new Elementary/Middle School Principal. It is our goal to provide a warm and welcoming school experience for our students and families by providing a well-rounded education to meet the unique learning needs of all of our children. We place high value in forging partnerships between home, school, and the community as this builds the foundation for a successful educational experience for our students. With that said, Forward Ministries is graciously providing school supplies for our K-5 students!

As we approach the 2021-2022 school year, there will be many amazing opportunities made available in which your child can be involved. Some of these opportunities will include the introduction of STEM to our 4th and 5th graders, the reimplementation of a gifted and talented program, and the continuation of 5th grade Band as well as Art, Music, Library and PE for all of our K-5 students. Newton Falls Elementary/Middle School is proud to announce that we received the PBIS Bronze award for our continued efforts and dedication to make social-emotional learning and student well-being a top priority! Additionally, we will be introducing the 'Leader in Me' program to infuse social-emotional learning into all aspects of student learning. We will also have a hypoallergenic therapy dog in our building to help provide social-emotional support and motivation to our students.

Bus Orientation will take place in the middle school cafeteria on Thursday, August 19, at 10:00 a.m. This orientation is for kindergarten and new students who have never ridden a Newton Falls school bus to or from school. Open house is scheduled for Wednesday, August 25th from 5:30 p.m. – 7:30 p.m. This event will kick off at the high school gymnasium at 5:30 p.m. and then families will be dismissed to their child's respective school buildings. Class lists will be posted on the front of the old elementary building on Friday, August 20. All students in grades 1–5 will begin school on Thursday, August 26.

Kindergarten students will be doing a staggered start – meaning that they will only attend ONE full day the first week to better acclimate them to their new school and teachers. During this day, they will be given the Kindergarten Readiness Assessment, take a tour of the building, and spend time with their teacher having their questions and worries answered to set their minds at ease. Kindergarten students with last names A-M will attend school on Thursday, August 26th. Kindergarten students with last names N-Z will attend school on Friday, August 27th

School buses will drop the students off in front of the building daily, and pick them up at the same place to bring them home. Student drop off and pick up is through the loop on the right side of the building facing the school. Parents picking up their child are to enter the loop on the right side of the building and follow the directions of the staff assigned to the pick-up line.

HEALTH UPDATES

As we begin the 2021-22 school year Covid is still with us. Trumbull County has been seeing a steady increase in the number of delta variant covid cases in the past few weeks. Although the delta variant has not resulted in more severe illness or increased deaths, it is more highly contagious and according to the CDC can be acquired and transmitted to others even by those fully vaccinated. Our goal in Newton Falls Schools is to provide full time in person education this year.

What we are doing at school:

- Temperature monitoring upon arrival
- Frequent disinfection of commonly touched surfaces.
- Readily available hand sanitizer/handwashing opportunities.
- Maintaining at least a 3 foot distance in classrooms and cafeteria.
- Ongoing surveillance of Covid cases and implementation of quarantine protocols.
- Students must wear face coverings while on the school bus per CDC guidelines.
- Face coverings inside the school will be optional
- Non-essential visitors will continue to be limited

Here is how you can help: please monitor your child daily for symptoms of Covid. The typical symptoms include:

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatique
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

These symptoms tend to be very mild in children and can appear to be a cold or allergy. If your child has any of these symptoms, please keep him or her at home and contact your healthcare provider. Students with any of these symptoms should remain at home until symptom free for at least 24 hours.

In addition to students staying at home when they are sick, they should also stay home if:

- Any household member is being tested due to symptoms of Covid or is diagnosed with Covid
- Your child has been exposed to anyone with Covid.

Notify the school nurse immediately if someone in your household has been diagnosed with Covid.

TECHNOLOGY SUPPORT FOR STUDENTS AND PARENTS

If any student and/or parent has any questions or concerns about technology used within the classroom or for connecting to educational services supported by the school district, please contact the district's technology office for assistance. CHROMEBOOK ASSIGNMENT FOR STUDENTS

Each student (K-12) is assigned a chromebook and chromebook charger to be used for this classroom. They will be assigned at the beginning of the school year (or even at open house times). These chromebooks are turned in at the end of the school year for updates and cleaning. Once a chromebook is assigned to a student, they will have the same chromebook returned back to them the following school year (unless the chromebooks are replaced through the district's rotation plan. As budget permits, grades K, 5, 9, will receive new chromebooks each year). If a chromebook or charger cords are not returned at the end of the school year, there may be issues with the student receiving another chromebook the next school year. The technology office will make every attempt possible to contact parents to have chromebooks returned at the end of the school year. Chromebooks cost \$300 per unit, with \$40 per charger cord and are property and managed by the school district. If a student is experiencing issues with a chromebooks, please contact the technology department for assistance.

FILTERED INTERNET

Under Federal Law, the school district is required to filter the Internet to all students. The technology department works with our local ITC (NEOMIN), as well as, monitors the activity of use of the Internet through the school network. If the district did not have this filtering in place, we would not be eligible for any Federal Funding such as eRate (helps offset the cost of the Internet) or Federal Title Funding. We ask that you help us in protecting your children while they are on the Internet. Please review the Student Internet Use Policy and the GoGuadian Parent App Sections for more information.

STUDENT EMAIL

Every Newton Falls student will be assigned a school email address. This email is used for many things including signing into their chromebooks. They also need these accounts to connect with their teachers and for use with Google Classroom. This email is filtered and students are not able to receive email messages from outside of the @nfschools.org domain (unless there is an educational related site that is used by teachers and/or quidance counselors).

TECHNOLOGY OF DEPARTMENT UPDATES

STUDENT INTERNET USE POLICY

Each year, students and parents are furnished with the Student Internet Use Policy. This is a board approved policy that outlines the proper usage of computers and the Internet within the school district. If a student violates any conditions within this policy, potential discipline actions may take place. Please be sure to sit down with your child(ren) and review this policy each year in order to ensure their safety on the Internet and proper usage of technology for educational purposes.

PARENT AND STUDENT GRADEBOOK ACCESS (PROGRESSBOOK)

Parents and Students are able to access grades online to monitor progress and check for missing assignments and lesson plans from teachers. There are two different ways to obtain an account to login to the site. 1) Students are able to login automatically to the ProgressBook site by using their school provided email address. This was implemented in the 2020-21 school year and now students do not need to have a separate account for ProgressBook. 2) Parents will need to request a security code from the Technology office in order to create their account. In order to obtain the security code, you must be registered as a contact with the appropriate school office. New registrations are provided with a form that you can fill out and the technology office will email you the security code, or you can request one from the technology office using the help desk or by email. Further information and instructions are posted on the district's website.

GOGUARDIAN PARENT APP

Parents are not able to monitor their child's activity on the Internet the same way their teachers, administrations, and the technology department can through the use of the GoGuardian Parent App. GoGuardian is a software program that is implemented by the district to monitor and filter internet activity for students. If a student spends hours upon hours not working on school work and just watching YouTube videos, the teacher and school district is aware of this, and now parents can be aware as well. This app runs on Android and Apple phones. There is a form and directions on the district's website that can be used to request access to your student's Internet activity.

DISTRICT EMAIL LIST FOR INFORMATION

The school district employs 4 different methods in making announcements to the community and parents: we have an automated system that will place out phone calls to all registered phone numbers with the district, we post information on the district's website, we post information on the district's Facebook Page, and we now email the same information out to a district wide email list. If you would like to receive notices via email, please make sure you sign-up on the email list. You can sign-up on the email list through the district's website.
